Muslims, Hindus, and Buddhists appreciate the love Christians show them when they come to America. Pastor Kevin Bailey (right) had a couple from India move to his Dallas neighborhood and started attending his church without knowing anything about Jesus. They invited him to come to their house to tell their friends what Christmas was about. He was happily surprised to find over 12 people stuffed into their living room. But Kevin was ill-equipped to reach this people group, so he joined the DFW Diaspora Coalition and connected with Grant Goodrich (left). Grant led them to local believers reaching people from Asia and was able to help Pastor Bailey provide assistance to this immigrant family.





On December 10 Forest Meadow Church and First Sudanese Baptist Church hosted a Christmas Fest for 250 immigrant families in the Vickery Meadow and Lake Highlands area. With help from the DFW Diaspora Coalition, this included block party games, ethnic foods, music, a Christmas story presentation, and the distribution of 500 blankets and food.
