John 20:21: Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you."







We start inside prison walls to equip and empower disciples to become the next generation of Christian church leaders to positively influence Houston's inner-city communities and beyond.

We take a holistic approach to prison ministry, ministering to the offender and the correctional staff and allowing both sides to find support in Christian-based resources and programs. We do this through our "prison adoption" model, where our team takes an entire prison unit and works with them to positively impact and transform their homes, churches, places of work, and neighborhoods.

Individuals participating in our programs can take advantage of a wide variety of opportunities, including *worship services, marriage conferences, budgeting/finance workshops*, and *bonding time with children*.





THE URBAN MINISTRY INSTITUTE OF HOUSTON

In addition to our prison adoption programs, Epiphany Life Change offers several classes certified by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice. Men and women involved with Epiphany Life Change can take advantage of these courses. Here's a glimpse at just a few:

Conversion and Calling

- Foundations for Christian Mission
- God the Father



CHRISTIAN ANGER MANAGEMENT PROJECT

The Christian Anger Management Program (CAMP) helps participants better understand their anger. This course explores how God expects us to control anger and how best to manage it. Students will learn techniques to handle hostile emotions in themselves as well as in others. Weekly book reports and other homework are assigned. Classes are small to encourage open discussion.





THE JOURNEY

The "Journey" is a three-part program, which begins with "Foundations." During this part of the course, we will help participants repair their broken hearts and spirits. We do this by looking at Jesus' heart and how we can be healed in the unity of His heart with ours.

"Fragments to Freedom" is the next part of the course, where will dig a little deeper with participants to understand how their experiences as a child contributed to the person they are today. We also focus on redemptive gifts and how they can be restorative and healing. The third part of the Journey curriculum is the "Flourishing" stage, where we bring everything together and help participants restore wholeness to their marriages, families, churches, and society.






THE ONESIMUS WORKSHOP

Designed specifically for churches, the Onesimus workshop prepares places of worship to welcome those recently incarcerated into their congregations. We work hand-in-hand with churches to understand how to accept returning citizens and play an active role in their transition back into society.
